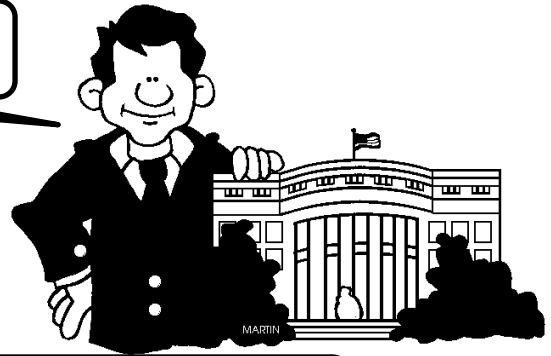

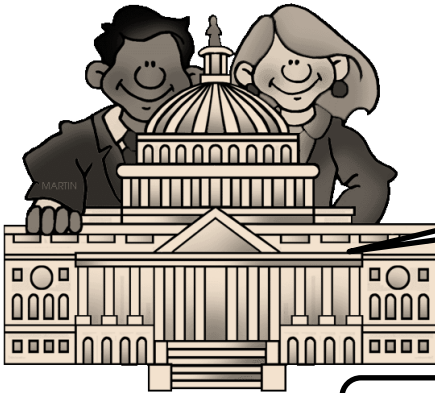

I'm the President, where do I find my powers?



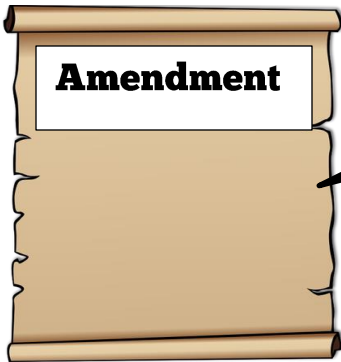
