Holloween History

Did you know that Halloween can be traced back to the ancient Celtic festival called Samhain? The Celtics were a group of people who lived in Europe many years ago. Samhain was a celebration that marked the end of the harvest season (October 3lst) and the beginning of the winter season. People believed ghosts would come on that day to destroy the crops that were stored for the winter. During the festival, people would light big bonfires and wear disguises to protect themselves. They would also carve scary faces into turnips, hoping to frighten the ghosts away.

In the mid 1900s, Halloween as we know it began to become popular.

Children's magazines, radio shows, and cartoons helped make the idea of trickor-treating become popular. People carved faces into pumpkins because they
were more plentiful and much easier to carve than turnips!


