

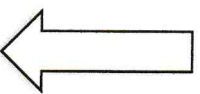
Expanding

Sentences

You can expand a sentence (make it longer) by adding details to the subject and/or the predicate.

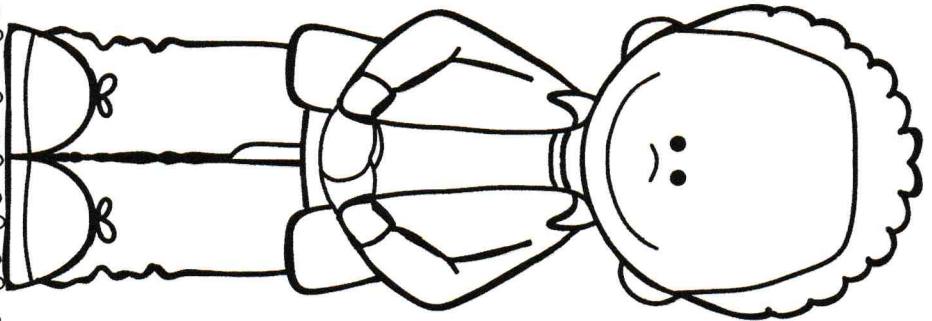
For example;

Billy is wearing a shirt
and jeans.



Billy is wearing a collared
yellow shirt and long
denim jeans.

***I added details
to the predicate
by describing Billy's
shirt and jeans***



Combining

Sentences

You can combine sentences that
have the same subject or
predicate.

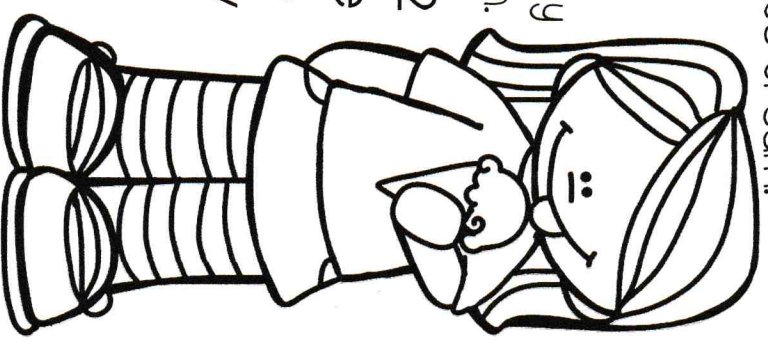
For example;

Tabatha likes strawberry ice cream.
Tabatha likes chocolate ice cream.



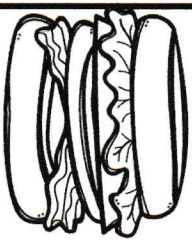
Tabatha likes strawberry
and chocolate ice cream.

***I combined the 2
sentences because
they had the same
subject. I did this by
using the linking
word "and."***



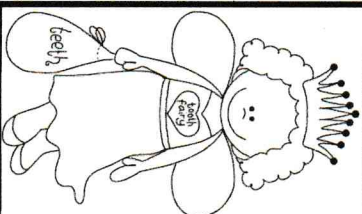

Vampire Bats

Vampire bats are a kind of bat that can be found in North and South America. The name "vampire" comes from the creatures in old folklore that would bite people and drink their blood. Vampire bats do feed on the blood of other mammals, but they really aren't that scary. They hunt in the middle of the night, usually looking for cattle or horses. They gently bite the animal and lick up the blood with their tongue. They don't take enough blood from the animal to hurt it, and sometimes the animal doesn't even wake up from sleeping. Vampire bats are not completely harmless, however, as they sometimes carry diseases that can spread to the animals they bite. Unlike other bats, vampire bats have very strong legs and can walk, run, and even jump.
