


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

Vampires bats are a kind of bat that can be found in North and South America. The name "vampire" comes from the creatures in old folklore that would bite people and drink their blood. Vampire bats do feed on the blood of other mammals, but they really aren't that scary. They hunt in the middle of the night, usually looking for cattle or horses.
