

- Trade links between city-states and other Mesoamerican groups
- Math and astronomy developed to support religious beliefs
- Pyramid builders
- Written language used hieroglyphs

### Mesoamerica: Aztec 1200-1521

- Government by warrior-kings
- Religion played a major role in society and rule
- Trade links between tribute states and other Mesoamerican groups
- Human sacrifice practiced for religious offerings
- Pyramid builders
- Pictorial written language

### South America: Inca 1400-1532

- Government by theocracy—sun-god king
- Religion played a major rule in society and rule
- Social welfare state cared for all people
- Extensive road system linked the country together
