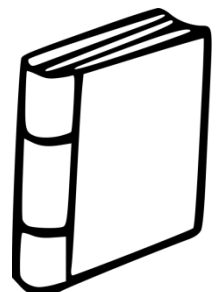
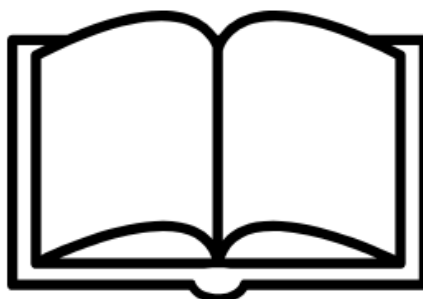
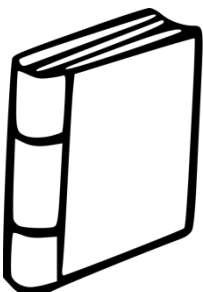
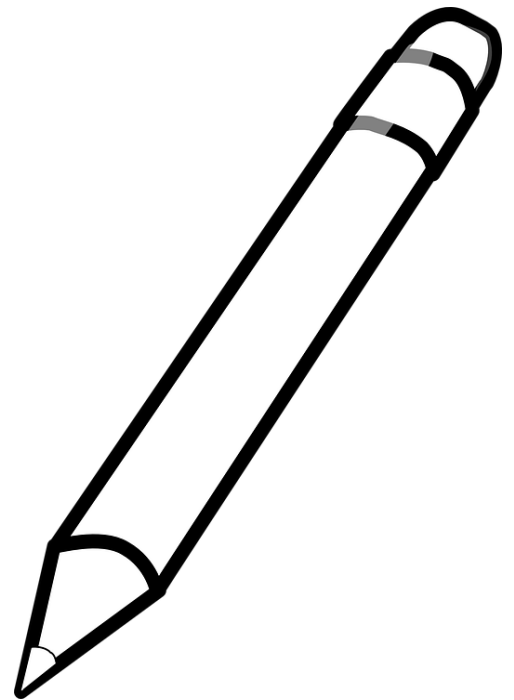
Subjects

10. The intelligent children are awesome at finding the subject of the sentence!



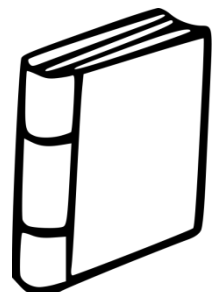
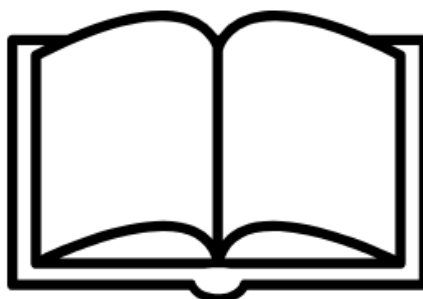
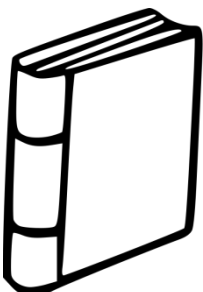
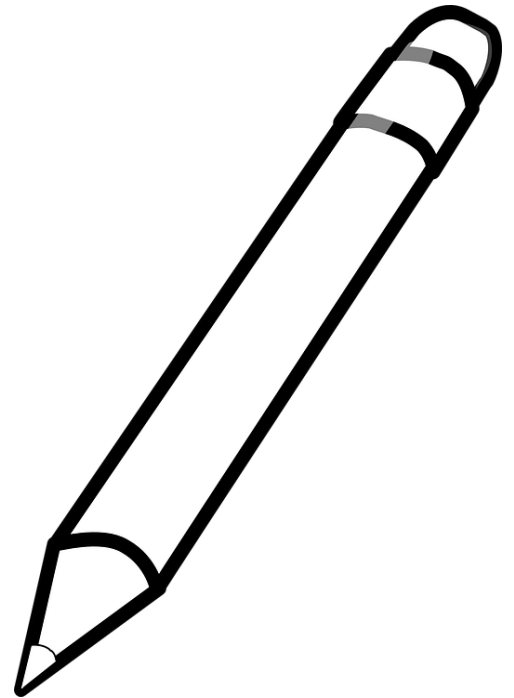
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
