












Family Tree Project Directions

This project is a great way for students to learn about their family heritage. It has several options available depending on age of your students and how much time you have to contribute to it.

Steps:


- I. Have students interview their parents or guardians using the family tree questionnaire.
- 2. Be sure to have students check the spelling of each family member.
- 3. Cut out the heart tree (color or black and white).
- 4. Have students pick a large piece of colored paper to use for the background. I used 12x12 scrapbook paper in the examples shown below. Construction paper works well also.
- 5. Copy the family tree cards. Have students pick each member of their family.
- 6. Write the names of each family member in the box below his/her picture.
- 7. Cut, color, and paste each family member on their family tree diagram in the correct spot as shown in the sample family tree diagram.
- 8. A page of family quotes and a title is included for students to decorate their diagrams.

An additional or second option is to create a Family Tree Booklet:

- Have students pick a cover for their booklets. There are 3 different tree illustrations included in this unit.
- Use the pages of the family member booklet to interview grandparents, parents, and siblings for their full name, date of birth, place of birth, and interesting facts.
- Have students bring in real photographs for each member, if desired.
- There are two photo box sizes: one is 4x6 and the other is for smaller images.
- Mix and match the pages to create a one of a kind family tree booklet.
