## Duke was a brilliant composer and musician.

Duke had his own series of Carnegie Hall concerts starting in 1943 and wrote some his best music for them. They were known as his "extended compositions", which means that they were much longer (sometimes 45 minutes) than most of his other music. Some people have said that his orchestra was his instrument because of the original and beautiful music he composed for it, but he always remained a great jazz piano player.

## **Duke earned the Presidential Medal of Freedom.**

In addition to writing jazz songs, he also composed ballets, musicals, film scores, and more. In 1969, President Nixon gave Ellington a 70th birthday party at The White House, and honored Duke by giving him the Presidential Medal of Freedom. This honor was fitting for a man who maintained a career for half a century based on selfexpression, integrity and individuality.
