

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


It is part of my **Phonemic Awareness Syllables Cut and Sort No Prep Worksheets you can get that here.**



I have many parents that love to help their kiddos so I send home the following page to help with cutting skills. Many parents appreciate the help and others toss it in the trash.

I also use these words as I encourage and help the kiddos as they cut. Sometimes I need to cut the rectangle for kiddos with fine motor difficulties then they only need one cut per line.



Cutting Skills!

We need to practice using our fine motor skills to cut paper! Please have me practice at home, using all these hints.

Think of a Race Car!

Scissors= car

Thumb= head of driver


Pointer and Middle Finger= Two feet in the car (on the bottom)

Lines= road



Rules:

- I. The driver's head must be up top, straight. (You can't drive upside down)
- 2. Tuck your elbow close to your side. (Keep Thumb UP)
- 3. At the end of the road, **STOP**. That's when you turn the paper!
- 4. If the road curves, SLOW DOWN!
- 5. Take your time! If you speed, you'll get pulled over by the police! (You don't want a ticket!)
- 6. Cruise to Cutting by following the rules!







Teacher Information

The rest of the pages are the syllable cut and sort pages. The first page is an easy, explicit lesson plan with sample. I like to include this for a substitute, parent volunteer, or aide.

Hint: I also make I set for Emergency Sub Plans.


The 2 pages following the lesson plan are the pages that go with that plan. I always print I stapled copy of all the pages for a reference.





The second sheet is the worksheet for the students. I always do these with them in small groups first. This really helps build vocabulary. I am always amazed at words they don't know.

The last sheet in each set are the answer keys. I have found that this also works to differentiate or adapt the lesson for students that need it. I just print this sheet, and they are matching.

Materials:

paper, scissors, glue, crayons (if time)

Procedure:

I. Have each student write name on line.

2. Practice reading sentence with name.

3. Clap sorting pictures.

Student-goat-(I claps) Student-dragon-(2 claps) Student-octopus-(3 claps)

4. Clap each picture and have the student clap after you.

Teacher-koala-(3 claps)

Student-koala -(3 claps)

5. Continue with all pictures

king-(1 clap)

maraca-(3 claps)

sombrero-(3 clap)

yak- (I clap)

under-(2 claps)

6. Have students sort pictures by cutting and pasting.


