In informative writing, conclusions are also very important and come at the end of your writing.


They can:
-give a sense of closure
-wrap up your piece

Strong Ways to End:

-Give a summary
-Share your feelings
-Quote
-Suggestion for reader to do
something or think something
-Ask a question

Weak Ways to End:
-Saying "Those are all my facts..."
-Give new information or new facts

As Ms. Grum said, "Native American tribes all have unique characteristics".


