In informative writing, conclusions are also very important and come at the end of your writing.

They can:

- give a sense of closure**
- wrap up your piece**

Strong Ways to End:

- Give a summary**
- Share your feelings**
- Quote**
- Suggestion for reader to do something or think something**
- Ask a question**

Weak Ways to End:

- Saying "Those are all my facts..."**
- Give new information or new facts**

Examples of Conclusions:

	In conclusion, there are many ocean animals in the sea.
	All in all, I will always feel very fond of my pet, even if it's a lot of work to take care of.
	As Ms. Grum said, "Native American tribes all have unique characteristics".
