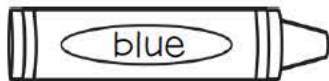

He was having a snack when the phone rang. Kelvin answered. "Hello?"

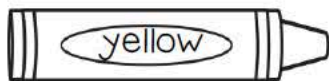
"Hi, sweetie," his grandma replied. "I heard you have a week off of school. Would you like to come visit me? I can take you to the zoo!"

"Just me?" Kelvin asked excitedly. He never got to spend time with Grandma when his little brother and sisters weren't there.

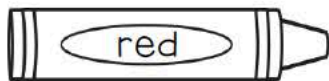

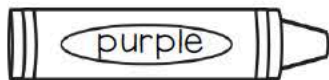
Whose car broke down a few weeks ago?



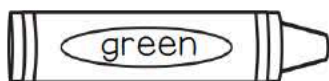
What was Kelvin doing when Grandma called?

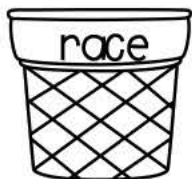

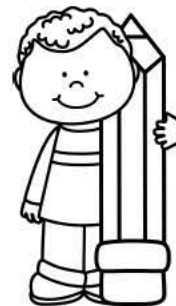
