3 Parts to an Informative Piece

Introduction to Topic	Author tells the reader what topic or book they will be discussing. Introduction should catch the reader's attention.
Body- Facts and Details	Author supplies facts to give further information about the topic or text.
Closure	Author wraps up the informative writing piece. Sometimes will give a call to action or ask a question.

Introductions

In informative writing, introductions are very important.

They can:

- introduce reader to topic
- introduce reader to text

This sentence comes **before** you begin to give facts.

Strong Ways to Begin:

- Ask a Question
- Use Onomatopoeia
- Use a Comparison
- Relate to Reader
- Quotation
- Fun Fact or Statement
- Statistic

Weak Ways to Begin:

- Saying "I am going to tell you..."
